Read or listen to the article on “Materials” from World Book Kids to learn what a material is and the different types of materials.

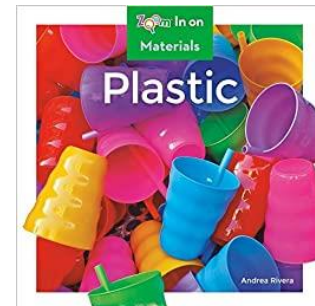
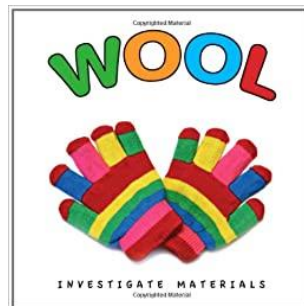
Make a list of the different types of materials you know, like wood or metal.
